

Lisa Lonie is the carillonner of Princeton University, as well as at St. Thomas' Church, Whitmarsh, PA, and at the oldest carillon (1882) in North America located at the Church of the Holy Trinity (Rittenhouse Square) in Philadelphia.

She is a carillonner member of the Guild of Carillonners in North America (GCNA), former chair of the Examinations Committee, and has served on its Board of Directors and on a variety of committees. She is also a regional instructor for the North American Carillon School. Lisa began her carillon studies as a teenager with Frank Law, carillonner at the Washington Memorial National Carillon in Valley Forge, PA and continued with Frank DellaPenna, Mr. Law's successor.

Known for her musical wit and creative programming, Ms. Lonie is a frequent recitalist throughout the U.S., Canada, and Europe. She also is one of the featured performers on the CD recording, "Princeton Carillon, Class of 1892" and on the NBC television special "Ringing in the Holidays at Longwood Gardens." Over 10,000 copies of her solo CD of carillon music, "The Bells of Christmas at Longwood Gardens," have been sold.

Besides her musical interests, Lisa is the Assistant Chief of Staff at Haverford College, is grandmom to five, and resides in Blue Bell, PA with husband, Paul, and assorted wildlife.

About the performers

Good friends and colleagues, Janet Tebbel and Lisa Lonie have been performing as a duo team since the early 90s. They are both recognized soloists on their own, with decades of combined artistic and teaching experience with the carillon.

As The Treblemakers traveling duet carillonneurs, they have appeared in many carillon festivals and summer series throughout North America and Europe. In 2014 they represented the North American Guild of Carillonneurs at the World Carillon Federation congress in Antwerp and Bruges, Belgium. They then embarked on a one week tour of The Netherlands, performing on a variety of modern and historical carillons, one of which dated to 1659. In March 2017, they participated in the International Carillon Festival, Bok Tower Gardens, Florida – one of the most prestigious week-long carillon recital events in the world.

Janet Tebbel is the carillonner of two carillons in the historic Germantown section of Philadelphia. She has served as carillonner of the First United Methodist Church of Germantown, playing the 50 bell Taylor carillon, since 1979; and has also been carillonner of the Miraculous Medal Shrine, with a 47 bell Paccard/Bigelow carillon, since 2002.

Janet began her carillon studies at the University of Michigan and continued to play at the University of Rochester, New York while earning a Master's degree at the Eastman School of Music. With a grant from the Belgian-American Educational Foundation, she attended the Royal Carillon School in Mechelen, Belgium, earning a final diploma from the school.

She has played recitals throughout North America and Europe, and became a carillonner member of the Guild of Carillonneurs in North America in 1974. She serves as Vice President of the Guild, as well as chair of the Events Committee. She has been featured in videos with Piffaro and Philomusica, and most recently on WHYY-TV.
